SCRIPTURE REFLECTION: John 4:5-42

Samaria was a region south of Galilee and north of Judah. While Samaritans continued some Jewish practices and beliefs, they were viewed as outsiders to Judaism. This separation grew over the centuries. By the time of Jesus, the enmity between Jews and Samaritans was severe.

Verse 4 is revealing: "But he had to go through Samaria." Other routes were available for Jews to bypass Samaria. So for John to say Jesus had to go through Samaria suggests other reasons. At the head of that list would be Jesus' ministry among those considered to be "outsiders." Jesus enters Samaria, initiates conversation with a Samaritan woman, and accepts hospitality from the Samaritan community.
